

Mission Statement: Bay Area Hearing Voices Network seeks to expand public awareness, provide community support, and refuge for those who hear voices, see visions, and experience other forms of extraordinary perception.

History: The Hearing Voices Movement (HVM) originated in the 80s in the Netherlands and subsequently inspired voice hearers, peer workers and allies in the UK and other parts of Europe. Over the past two decades hearing voices networks and local groups have developed around the world. InterVoice, based in the United Kingdom, currently serves as the international organizing network of the hearing voices movement.

The Bay Area Hearing Voices Network was launched in 2014, building on the past work of organizers in the greater San Francisco area. Current members of the BAHVN board include peers, family members, advocates, researchers and clinicians.

Support groups are co-facilitated by people who have lived experience with the mental health system. More importantly, we are counting on you to shape the direction the group takes in providing support for each other.

The Hearing Voices Network is comprised of people who see, hear, feel and think things that others may not experience, and members of their families and support network.
