Lovell); and *Child Survival*. Forthcoming are: *Kidney Hunter: Trafficking with the Transplant Traffickers* and *The Ghosts of Montes de Oca; Naked Life and the Medically Disappeared - A Hidden Subtext of the Argentine Dirty Wars*
